SSTA, Beth Miller

Beth reported that there is a newsletter and advised on teachers policy on communicating with parents. Teachers do not want to allienate their best supporters, parents and students. Teachers have a choice as to how they want to communicate with parents. Parents should feel free to contact teachers.

Grade 12 students: Exams and marks necessary for graduation and university admission will be done as needed. Teachers are in negotiations for the long hull and are not going to be provoked to escalate. Dallas wanted to publicly acknowledge that Beth is doing a very good job in a difficult situation.

Teachers are philosophically against fundraising activity for things that should be provided by the ministry of education. It makes school unequal depending on ability of a school to fundraise within a district. The employers are indicating that 15% of the job

is not being done by teachers currently and possibly require reimbursement. This appears to be a high estimate to say the least.

What is a good way to communicate with teachers? The teachers can come to PAC meetings. Feel free to phone, visit or e-mail teachers. It is up to the individual teacher how they want to communicate.

Field trips may be affected because there is so much paperwork involved. If a volunteer parent were to do it, it is possible.

How will it affect grade 12 students and their graduation? There will be no affect.
